If approved, the state pays 100% of tuition minus any other scholarships. We currently have 4 students.</p> <p>>Science Fair for 7th and 8th grade is Monday Feb. 16. The 5th and 6th graders will do a social studies fair as a scaled down version in April. This is to prepare them for the rigors of the Science Fair</p> <p>>Catholic High School committee: Fr. Mike, Rita and Jessica Conny met with Paul Ward, Superintendent of the Dioceses to discuss a high school. The Bishop says it needs to be a central school and all parishes would contribute to it and the support isn't there. The committee is still committed to the project and believes there is funding available to support it. They plan to develop a program and ID costs and funding sources. 	<p>receives money for each Ohio resident, grades K-8 (approximately \$787/student), VI-B (federal money funneled through state) is money for identified handicapped students served on Dec. 1, Title 1 (fed money funneled through the state) money based on number of Ohio residents who meet income guidelines for free or reduced lunches.</p> <p>Intervention specialist-works with students with an identified disability. 4 ¼ hours per day. Partially funded with VI-B, the balance by Auxiliary Services money.</p> <p>Speech therapist- 4 hours per week.</p> <p>Title 1 – 3 hours per day. Funded by Title 1 only.</p> <p>TAG (Talented And Gifted) program – 2.5 days per week. Funded with Auxiliary services money.</p> <p>Nursing – 4 hours services per day.</p> <p>Auxiliary clerk – 3 hours per day, required position because of Auxiliary funds.</p> <p>All the above personnel are employees of Marietta City Schools with their salary and benefits.</p> <p>Auxiliary Services money is also used to purchase all secular text books for grades K-8, and materials and equipment for art, music and PE. It can be used to purchase for students but not staff.</p> <p>Technology: Auxiliary funds have been used to purchase all new computers for the lab twice and will be done again this year, printers on the classrooms, server and switch, and some classroom computers (some donated).</p> <p>High School credit: 8th grade students can receive high school credit if the teacher holds a high school certificate and we follow the 9th grade curriculum. 9th grade algebra has been an option since 2000/01 academic year. 9th grade English was added this current school year.</p>
