



What is National Catholic Schools Week?

Since 1974, National Catholic Schools Week is the annual celebration of Catholic education in the United States. It starts the last Sunday in January and runs all week, which in 2025 is January 26 – February 1. The theme for National Catholic Schools Week 2025 is "Catholic Schools: United in Faith and Community." Schools typically observe the annual celebration week with Masses, open houses and other activities for students, families, parishioners and community members. Through these events, schools focus on the value Catholic education provides to young people and its contributions to our church, our communities and our nation.

This year we invite our families to a school wide breakfast and an opportunity to visit your child(rens) classrooms. We are replacing the spaghetti luncheon that we have done for several years with a breakfast to be held on Tuesday, January 28th beginning at 8:30 AM. We will gather in the Parish Center for breakfast and then visit classrooms with an end time scheduled for 10:00 AM. We are collecting RSVPs for the breakfast to help the committee prepare. An email was sent to all families on January 15th with a QR code or link to RSVP. We request all RSVPs be in by Tuesday, January 21^{st.}
